

Resident SPOTLIGHT GLEN K.



On May 6th, Glen turned 100 years old. He was born in 1923. He was raised on a dairy farm in Scranton, Pennsylvania. Glen attended Kingston Township high school. He played the clarinet for 2 years and enjoyed every bit of it.

Growing up on a dairy farm was no fun for Glen. He did not want to spend his weekends taking care of the cows. He said the cows needed to be milked twice a day; it was just too much work and drove him to volunteer in the Army Air Corp in 1941. The eighteen-year-old high school graduate had been in radio school at Scott AFB, Illinois, for two months when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor and thrust the United States into war.

After twenty weeks of radio school, he completed six weeks of Gunnery School at Tyndall AFB in Panama City, Florida. Then at MacDill AFB in Tampa, in May of 1942, he was assigned to

the newly created 91st Bomb Group, 322nd Bomb Squadron, Bader's Crew. The name of their crew was called the Heavyweight Annihilators. On January 3rd, 1943,mission to St. Nazaire, France they were hit by a flak on the right wing as its last bomb was released. Engine number four was engulfed in flames while engine number three began malfunctioning. Unable to keep up, the plane fell out of formation. They were lost. At the low altitude hugging the sea, their destiny looming over the frigid water, Bader informed Glen of their plight over the interphone. "Glen," Bader calmly directed, "bring us home." Those last three words are forever seared into Glen's memory.



Some of Glen's missions include, Brest, France, 1942, Emden, Germany, 1943, Paris, France, 1943, Hage, Germany, 1943 and many more. He also served with the Cliburn's crew of the 324th squadron. They headed to Hamm, Germany's railway yards on the Bad Penny on February 4th, 1943. During this mission, Glen was shot in the shoulder, earning him the Purple Heart. To this day, he still carries that bullet wedged in his shoulder.

Glen went on to serve in the Korean War, completing thirty-two years in the Air Force (twenty active, twelve civil service) and retiring as Master Sergeant. After his retirement in 1975, Glen continued doing what he loved most, which was a Ham radio operator. He enjoyed talking to people all over the world.



Glen met his wife Leona at a drug store in St. Louis Missouri. She was a telephone operator. They were married in October 1943. He said the wedding was very small and only included his and her parents. They had a beautiful marriage that lasted for 65 years until she passed away January 24th, 2010. He and his wife had been living in Okeechobee since 1962. They have five children and lots of grandchildren; he states too many to count!

Glen stayed at Grand Oaks for a couple of days before making the decision to move in permanently on September 18th, 2023. He said he loves living here because the residents are very nice, the food is great, and the staff are wonderful.
